

## Country Comfort Wood Stove

*Features articles on, and plans for, twenty-six country homes, from a small lake-side cottage to a large rustic woodland retreat*

*Beatrix Potter was one of the inventors of the contemporary picture book, and her small novels published at the turn of the twentieth century are still available and popular today. Writing in Code is the first book-length study of Potter's work, and it covers the entire oeuvre, examining all facets of her work in relation to her private life. Daphne Kutzer reveals the depth of the symbolism in Potter's work and relates this to the issues of the author's own development as an independent woman and writer, and her struggles with domesticity, Unitarianism, and the socio-political issues in late-19th and early-20th century England. Weaving the subtle themes inscribed in Potter's own stories with the concerns and temperament of the author who wrote them, Kutzer exemplifies literary criticism as it can illuminate the breadth of allusion in children's literature.*

*When Virginia and Michael begin recovery from alcoholism in Alcoholics Anonymous, they correspond several times a week. They view letter writing and their deepening relationship as a lifeline in the chaos of change. Letters selected from over 2000 written during the next five years chronicle the raw material of their recovery. As their recovery becomes increasingly mired in conflict between the deception required to maintain their relationship and "rigorous honesty" required to attain lasting sobriety, Hoot and Gin (alter egos) spontaneously emerge in the writing. With the mobility of mental apparitions, these "kids" are traded back and forth by their adult counterparts, nurturing, modeling new behaviors, broaching sensitive subjects, and teaching the healing art of laughing at self. They help the adults move through stuck places and give up stubborn resistance to change. For anyone contemplating recovery or living with an alcoholic, who is questioning how Twelve Steps can have any practical application to a situation as complicated as theirs, Hoot 'n Gin reveals how two skeptical people eventually find all twelve are gifts, not punishment. This trip through the Twelve Steps demonstrates how the act of letter writing can augment a recovery program by encouraging introspection, lending support, and measuring progress.*

The northeast cooperative woodstove study, conducted during the winter of 1988-89, measured particulate stack emissions using the AWES sampling system from 25 new-technology stoves installed in homes in the Glens Falls, N.Y. area. Five stove brands, 3 catalytic and 2 non-catalytic, were selected for the study based on their performance in a laboratory durability test. Each stove brand was represented by 5 stoves. The catalytic stoves were represented by the Blaze King Royal Heir, Country Flame BBF and the Oregon Woodstove. The non-catalytic stoves were the Country Comfort CC150 and the mid-size Regency. Each stove was sampled for 5 weekly periods spanning early January to late March. This type of sampling schedule provided an opportunity to document trends in stove emissions over the heating season as well as average performance.
